SPRING 2021 PRIORITY REGISTRATION

The California Community College Board of Governors approved a policy change to establish system-wide registration priorities in an effort to improve student success. Students now register for courses according to an enrollment priority system as defined by Title 5 regulations and the Hartnell Community College District.

	Only units completed at Hartnell through Summer 2020 are used in determining priority registration. Your registration priority group and registration date are determined by the completion of the 2 Core Services (Orientation, and Student Education Plan), the number of units completed and in-progress at Hartnell Community College District, and maintaining good academic standing.) ASSESSMENT IS NO LONGER A REQUIREMENT TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PRIORITY REGISTRATION ASSESSMENT IS ONLY REQUIRED FOR ESL PLACEMENT

Priority Group: 03 October 27 – November 2	<u>Continuing & First Time Students</u> in good standing and fully matriculated will receive third priority: October 27 -Continuing students who have completed 32.0-60.9 units October 28 - Continuing students who have completed 15.0 -31.9 units October 29 - Continuing students who have completed 61.0-99.9 units October 30 - Continuing students who have completed .3 -14.9 units November 2- Continuing students who have completed 0.0 -.29 units; <u>and</u> First Time students who have completed all of the CORE Services	✓	✓
Priority Group: 04 November 3	Continuing, new first-time, returning, and transfer students who have <u>not</u> completed: Orientation and Student Ed Plans OR students not in good academic standing. Students must submit an online Application for Admission between October 1 st and November 2 nd to be eligible to register beginning on November 3 rd . Applications received on or after November 3 rd will be eligible to register 24 hours after submitting an Application for Admission.	2 core services have NOT been completed	
Priority Group: 05 November 3	<u>Continuing students exceeding 100 HCC degree applicable units.</u> Loss of Enrollment Priority registration specified above shall be lost at the first registration opportunity after a student has earned 100 or more applicable semester units at Hartnell College.		
Priority Group: 06 November 3	<u>Student not in Good Academic Standing</u> Loss of Enrollment Priority registration specified above shall be lost at the first registration opportunity after a student is placed on academic or progress probation or any combination for two consecutive terms. Dismissed students must have an approved Reinstatement Appeal Petition submitted with the Counseling Department to be eligible to register beginning on November 3 rd .		
Priority Group: 07 November 30	<u>Concurrent Enrollment (K-12) Students</u> Concurrent students must submit an online Hartnell Application for Admission and approved Concurrent Enrollment form before Tuesday November 24th to be eligible to register online beginning on November 30 th .		

The priority date shown above is the first day that a student is eligible to register based on their student type. Students may continue to register any day after their priority registration date until the last day to register which is the day before the term begins. (All registration systems will be turned off at 11:59pm the day before the semester begins)
