Hartnell will administer the ATI TEAS at no cost to invited phase 2 applicants.	ATI TEAS results are not accepted during phase 1 of the application process. The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is designed to specifically assess a students' preparedness entering the health science fields. The ATI TEAS exam consists of 170 questions, 20 of which are unscored pretest items. Questions are designed to test the basic academic skills you will need to perform in class in the areas of: Reading, Math, Science and English and Language Usage.
