


# A Day in the Life of our Students Video




# A Day in the Life of Our Students Table Activity





- I would really like to see the classified leadership academy come back
- This was great. I also enjoyed last year's career advice panel.
- Mr. Math reminded me of how I started at Hartnell. I lived in King City without a car, relying on rides from people I barely knew to make it to class. My parents, who were farm workers, supported me by giving me money for food, books, and transportation. Getting a student worker position was a turning point for me—it helped me grow as a person and eventually allowed me to afford my own little car.
- Music was too loud
- ONE Hartnell presentation could have been better. Possibly making a
  presentation that will have more people engaged in the presentation instead of
  just talking and talking which the message of the presentation was unclear. Also
  using more relatable scenarios for PowerPoint presentations.
- I think Caring Panther updates should not just come once or twice a year at the beginning of the semester. We should have better communication about Caring Panthers throughout the year. Our professional development at these sessions should not just be caring panthers related. We should have other professional development opportunities.
- The time utilized at this session for update on Caring Campus should be used to further Career Advancement. Just like faculty will receive the Caring Campus update in alternate means, so should classified and use this time to advance careers. How about having this time used where seminars on time management, computer skills, management skills (how does classified staff promote if they are never given opportunities to learn people management, time management etc. skills?) These should not be overbroad discussions but in depth capsulated information. (i.e. one session on a Microsoft product, such as Excel and only that product). A topic of meeting scheduling. How to organize a day, how to lead people. Small capsules which allows for more in depth content. In the past a generic topic that is at a beginning level has been presented and it benefits very few, as most are past broad coverage of a topic or topics. Another topic what is the Brown Act and who has to abide by it or Robert's Rules (the district did at one time sign agreement to abide by these rules at our meetings).

- I don't think the student panel is necessary; it's been done every time and even though this year was better, it's getting too repetitive.
- This year's Student Success Conference was a total ROLLER COASTER ride--there were highs and there were lows. President Gutierrez set the tone with positivity, excitement, and enthusiasm. However, then we had the Work Place Violence component, and that just brought the mood down. Everyone went from being excited to looking at our phones, watched, and being bored (if I am honest). I acknowledge that this is an important & REQUIRED element, but the timing and place to hold this 30min presentation should have NOT been done during the SSC. It killed the vibes from Pres. Gutierrez. The ONE Hartnell presentation was great and informative-- I appreciated how Dr. Pitman tied in all of the efforts (ATD, SWIM, etc) even though her last slide looked like Spiderman had created that web-graph. VP Pitman's initial opening remarks of the female Bikini Rock band (don't even remember the name) had zero cultural relevance and did not resonate with me or the crowd based on the looks on their faces. I do see how she attempted to tie it in to One Hartnell of supporting one another, but I think that was more of a PERSONAL reflection, that again, not many of us could relate to whatsoever. Maybe try something more general that the whole crowd can relate to? The video's were AMAZING (Day in the Life of a Student)... please continue doing those... I was getting really emotional, and it reminded me of my WHY and sense of Purpose. Student Panel w/ Dr. Math was OK. It seemed the facilitator was not on his "A game"... he seemed to be asking questions on the fly and not all the students had an opportunity to answer each question. I wish this component was better organized, perhaps giving the students the questions ahead, and letting them all know that everyone will have to answer each question, because I was genuinely interested to learn more about all of the student's stories. But again the facilitator kept jumping around from question to question, and not providing each student an equal opportunity to answer. Aside from the poor facilitation, the students were AMAZING! They were HIGHLIGHT of this SSC-- please keep doing this. The activity had great potential, but it was just too rushed. We literally had less than 5 mins to conversate. We needed more time in order for us to have a genuine, deep and meaningful conversation with

our partners to learn more about our journeys and stories. If you plan on doing something like this, please allocate adequate time because this just seemed like it was a [check mark] for "lets do something interactive" without thinking too much on it. Hora Feliz was a nice way to end the day-- thank you for doing that for all of the staff. It's greatly appreciated. Please keep doing it. Overall, thank you for all of the PD Committee's Efforts, I know it takes a lot of work to get something like this going and there's always room for improvement. I hope you consider my feedback and share it with the respective presenters/ speakers, because at the end of the day, they are the ones setting the tone for the whole event. And if they want an engaged audience, it all starts with them-- their presentations, sense of relevance, and organization, and enthusiasm. These conferences are a given event and can be planned for student participation.
