- Access to a course template, design resources, and aligned courses

- Instruction and examples related to Universal Design (equity and accessibility)

To satisfactorily complete the Academy, you will:

- Complete an Orientation or Welcome Module for one of the courses you teach
- Complete one full weekly module, including (at a minimum):
  - Weekly Overview
  - Lecture Content
  - Assignment(s)
  - o Discussion
  - Quizz(es)
  - Weekly Wrap-Up
- Participate in peer review and provide feedback to two of your colleague's courses

In addition, you will learn how to duplicate content and modules so you can more easily finish out your course after the Academy is complete.
