1. Dual Enrollment Report 2019 Laurencia Walker
Ms. Walker gave a detailed presentation regarding the Dual Enrollment Report for 2019. Assembly Bill 288 (2016) enables community college districts to enter into agreements with high school districts to offer dual enrollment courses located at the high school, with restricted

enrollment to high school students from that high school district, and at no cost to the student (i.e., no fees, no charge for textbooks, etc.). The intent of the legislation to promote higher education attainment to traditionally underserved student populations. Hartnell college has offered dual enrollment courses since Fall 2017; however, the Office of College Readiness was established in Spring 2018 to focus and streamline the college's early college credit options; with an emphasis on dual enrollment. We currently have agreements with every service area, public high school District. Courses offered range from Counseling, English, Administration of Justice, History, and Statistics to name a few. All students that participate in dual enrollment courses follow the same enrollment procedures as traditionally concurrently enrolled students including an application for admission and the placement process (if applicable to their course). Course selection and student participation are a result of a collaboration between high school staff, faculty, and administration in consultation and collaboration with Hartnell College faculty, staff, administrators. Areas of growth for the upcoming academic year include better defining the academic pathways to offer with the support of faculty and administration, helping students and families become more aware of the academic supports available to them (i.e., tutorial services, DSPS services, etc.). 2. Budget Presentation (Hartnell and State) Rick Bennett
Mr. Bennett was unavailable. Dr. Jalomo gave the presentation. The presentation is located on the council website for review. In 2018-19, 2019-20, and 2020-21, a district will receive the greater of the formula total or the amount the district received in 2017-18, adjusted by cost-of-living. The formula includes a hold harmless "stability" provision that delays any decreases in revenues through Fiscal Year 2022. The formula required goals and a comprehensive plan. Dr. Jalomo shared the Spring 2020 Enrollment report located on the council website. Mr. Phillips shared the Colleague data pertaining to college enrollment trends.

Ms. Peters informed the group regarding referring students to DSPS. There were 721 students this year which is a 9% increase from last year. The majority of those students have hidden disabilities which are not seen.
