INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

1. Meta Majors Hetty Yelland Hartnell College Meta-Majors are a group of academic majors with overlapping courses. The creation of MetaMajors is intended to provide clear direction to students based on their career and academic interests and to develop clear career or transfer pathways. Efforts are placed on supporting student's goals including but not limited to graduation, careers, transfer, and advanced degrees. A designated web page with links to career exploration information and salary and job market indicators will accompany the rollout of meta-majors. Most students are taking far too many earned units past the number required to complete their degree. They frequently do not select their program in which to major early in their studies at the College; when they do, they often rely on word of mouth information or make the decision based on limited information. This design is aimed at providing more comprehensive information to students when they first enter the College, including how Meta-Majors are linked to careers. It also allows students to make an early informed choice of MetaMajor that will assist them in choosing from a long list of programs offered by the College. Two committees taking on design implementation. Five counselors will be needed for the Meta Majors implementation team. Ms. Yelland shared the College Redesign Transition schedule which outlines the colleges steps in the redesign.

- 2. AP 4031: Academic Dishonesty

 Ms. Wright shared the newest version of the drafted Administrative Procedure. The wording was changed to include submitting incidents through the Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT) ticketing system. Dr. Jalomo stated that system is the Advocate reporting system located on the college website. A section of Academic Dishonesty has been removed to insert Instructor Disciplinary Action when Cheating/Plagiarism. Please send your suggested revisions to Ms. Wright and Ms. Hornstein. This item will be placed as an action item at the next council meeting.
- 3. Emergency Preparedness **Daniel Scott** Mr. Scott stated Hartnell has aligned with the Monterey County Health Department in accordance with the closures. Alisal is not a Hartnell operation due to the fact that the Alisal campus rents their operations. Due to this the Alisal campus and operations are closed. The mailroom is open Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10am-2pm. Hartnell College is closed to the public. The college continues to operate as closely to normal as possible. The college has reduced the number of staff on all campuses, doing most of the work from home, when possible. Campus Safety Officers are present at all three campuses. Additional resources have been allocated to the main campus to aid in the increased calls for service and increased need for more visibility and deterrence. Only those classified as "essential personnel" by the President and Cabinet are allowed to work on campus. Others have been approved to retrieve items as needed, which means they come to get what is needed and leave. No one who has not been approved to do so should be working in an office or classroom.
