There was an overall positive response. There was a suggestion to provide supporting materials at least two days in advance. Dr. Jalomo clarified that at times presenters are revising their presentations and that is what delays the supportive materials from being posted. One responded stated they felt different opinions and values were not respected. There was no additional comment on the survey to clarify. Ms. Reyes suggested an incentive, stipend, or meal voucher for students who participate.

Strengths: The strengths that the council identified were that the council discussions were relevant to the agenda items, meetings were conducted in a constructive, timely, and efficient manner, follow-up action items and persons responsible were clearly articulated, council cochairs were effective in managing meetings, training related to governance activities and participation was effective, council members had appropriate information to make informed recommendations, discussion and recommendations were data driven and supported by evidence,

Improvements: Encourage more student participation and continued participation from other campuses. Provide materials at least two days in advance, when possible.
