	Dual Enrollment- CCAP (College & Career Access Pathways)	Dual Enrollment- Non CCAP (aka Concurrent Enrollment)
Intent	Increase access to/success in higher ed for traditionally underserved students	Scholastic Advancement
Location	High School Site	Hartnell Campus
Time	During the high school day	Outside of the school day
Course Offerings	Determined in partnership with HC & HS District (prerequisites & placement adherence)	Selected independently by student (Any course available in course schedule in which students are eligible)
Course Enrollment	Restricted enrollment to hs students in participating district	Unrestricted enrollment (open to general public)
Enrollment Process	Guided support from HC Office of College Readiness	Self-guided process (HC Office of College Readiness support by request)
Unit Maximum	15 units, no more than 4 classes	Fall/Spring-9 units; Summer-6 units
Cost	\$0 cost to students (HC & HS cost share textbooks	Student is responsible for fees, textbooks, course materials, etc.
