- High school staff are reporting a great deal of apathy about attending college from the high school graduating seniors. These seniors were quarantined the last 3 months of their sophomore year and all of their junior year and as seniors are exhibiting signs of social isolation and indecision about their post-secondary plan after their senior year.
- The SSS/TRIO director along with Upward Bound/Talent Search director and the Dean of Student Success are working with the Salinas Union High School Director to plan a Jump Start to College for students this summer.
- The SSS/TRIO director participated in the tour and registration process for 50 North Monterey County High School seniors at the new Hartnell College Educational Center in Castroville.
- SSS/TRIO student Jane Sanchez Hernandez has been named the 2022 Hartnell College recipient of the \$20,000 Peggy and Jack Baskin Transfer Scholarship to be used at any University of California campus.
- On Friday, April 8, 2022, the SSS/TRIO Staff assisted Hartnell College Educational Talent Search staff with the first field trip of one hundred forty Rancho San Juan High School students to the Hartnell College main campus.
