4. Discuss Combining AA/SA Councils Permanently

**Romero Jalomo** 

Motion to recommend the AA/SA council meet separately permanently. Voting will be sent electronically.

Dr. Jalomo shared that at the end of last spring there was a proposal to combine both councils together. After discussion, it was decided to allow each council to meet separately for one month and jointly the next month.

Dr. Jalomo recommended having both councils meet separately as having them combined is too large of a group. Additionally, the issues presented at each council are non-instructional vs. the topics at the academic affairs council are primarily instructional, having a combined council doesn't allow enough time to address both.

Dr. Moorhouse shared it was confusing to be going back and forth every month, thinks it would be more consistent to either be combined or separate, didn't have a strong feeling either way.

Joy expressed her preference for just having the council meet on its own as having a combined meeting with a larger group makes it's more difficult to go through action items. Joy suggested meeting once a semester to share/discuss/update.

Maria shared that if we would have it combined permanently then it would be a smaller group.

Ben said it felt like starts and stops and it was hard to get momentum with the combined councils, it was hard to get things done meeting every other month. He agreed to either permanently separately or permanently combined, no strong preference for one.

Carol concurred with Ben and Jen about the continuity of the process and also mentioned taking all the members of each council is counterproductive and if we do move towards a permanent combination then we would need to review the membership.

Ariana shared she hadn't been on this council for a very long time but agreed with the rest of the group.

#### 7. Update on Panther Prep

#### **Ariana Rodriguez**

Ariana shared that the RSVP was sold out for both sessions at the main campus (over 400 students). Michelle Peters was invited to the partner meeting and shared the things students need to bring with them to have their intake process done for DSPS. Students are asked to self-identify if they are DSPS students, we so far have 20.

Students were asked if they wanted to work and there was a 96 response of students. Students are allowed to work up to 29 hours a week of panther prep.

This year we are offering a session for non-traditional (adult) students in English and Spanish. Video of financial aid will be played, and a financial aid rep will be present in each room.

Students who attend this event will have the \$100 deposit waived. 25 members of CSUMB will be in attendance (EOP Director, SSS Director, Registrar, etc) so that students can speak to them in regards to enrollment and to answer questions. Additionally, Hartnell deans will be in attendance to offer a warm hand off to facilitate the transfer process for students. This event will take place on April 15, 2024, 3-5 p.m.

Maria Ceja shared information on commencement, the first notification to students was sent out on 4/11/24. Students will be receiving 8 tickets each. 30 valedictorians this year.
