Informational/Discussion

College Planning Council - Apolonia: President Guiterrez chose the technical format and they are finalizing it before going to the board with it.

Academic Affairs Council - They were supposed to give a presentation for the Governance Redesign but it wasn't presented.

Diversity/EEO Advisory Committee -The importance of specialists and having EEO Representatives have a term of 2 years. There was a DEI training on March 17th where people on the DEEOA Committee received training. The committee handbook was also updated.

Professional Development Committee - Will had nothing to report.

Administrative Services Committee - Leo: Was not there

Accreditation Council - Bryan: Gave information on Guided Pathways and the need for student feedback. The council is going to be integrated into another council **Advancement Council** - David: There was success in obtaining grants and having a large collaboration between the K-16 Central Coast region and we're receiving a planning grant for that. Here are some key issues that need to be resolved:

- Some services are not scaled to meet student needs
- There is inadequate integration of student support services and academic interventions
- The organization tends to operate in silos rather than in integrated ways to better help students succeed
- Communication with students tend to lack strategic execution
- Many students drop out and do not complete their educational goal
- Many students take too many years to complete
- Many students take many more earned units to complete than required
