III. Old Business:

3.01 Nov Popup Pantry Sen Ramos

Discussion

This item was to request support and volunteers for the Thanksgiving pop-up pantry. Oscar asked for volunteers to help from 10 am - 2 pm

3.02 Socksgiving Sen Ramos

Discussion/Action

This item was to get volunteers from the ASHC to help with the Socksgiving program. Guillermo asked for students to reach out for more sock donations and passed out flyers to share information.

IV. New Business:

4.01 December Budget Pres Preciado

Discussion/Action

This item was to review, discuss and go over the December budget. The Lights of Love total donation program (400-500 toys) for children (of a certain age range) will be done through an application process.

We got 430 submissions, and it closes next week. We encourage staff to buy 2 gifts at \$5/each =\$10. ASHC will be wrapping gifts to help.

Lights of Love open will be open until 11/18, and staff pick-ups will be from 11/28-12/2. ASHC will be wrapping from 12/5-12/9. Students can pick up gifts from 12/12-12/16.

Laura motioned to approve \$2000 for the Lights of Love gift drive

In-person members voted: 7 yes and 2 no.

Daniel then asked how much was in the ASHC account before the online vote was taken.

Forrest said that we had \$16,000 total, but we have spent \$4000 on food and supplies since then, bringing us down to \$12,000.

Online members voted: 3 no's

Total votes on the motion: 7 yes and 5 no's

The motion passed to approve the \$2000 for the Lights of Love drive.

4.02 Festival of Trees Dir of ICC Martinez

Discussion/Action

This item was to approve the budget for the Festival of Trees and the purchase of prizes and five Christmas trees that will be decorated by clubs and donated to families in need.

This item was to discuss the draft of the governance redesign for the college planning council.

Dr. Hough gave a presentation on governance redesign for the whole college. The questions they wanted to answer were, "Can Governance Be More Efficient? Can It Support Guided Pathways? Can It Be More Representative?"

The new governance structure of the College Planning Council will be renamed and created to encourage more staff and student involvement.

The 5 categories of the council will be:

- Hartnell College Council
- Equity Assurance Council oversees hiring practices and opportunities for students and faculty
- Institutional Resources Council -
- Student Success Council -
- Technology Learning Support Council -

They want to see more student and faculty involvement with 5 students for 5 councils where students serving will receive a stipend.

There will be a hybrid option to represent other campuses too.
