4.01 SEP Review

Presentation

Jay Singh gave a presentation in regards to the 2022-2025 Student Equity Plan. He mentioned that there were six questions he had for all of us and wanted to start a conversation and obtain feedback from the students. Director Preciado mentioned that she took a six year gap and when coming back she found DSPS to be a great help. She said that students sometimes don't ask for help because they might not be used to it or they might not know who to ask for help. Senator Rodriguez explained how he felt when first coming to Hartnell. He used the word "stressful" to let others know that he knew little info, did not know how to sign up for classes and was struggling to find help. Student Austin Mojica added on to Senator Rodriguez's statement by saying that he also felt confused and lost when first joining Hartnell. Treasurer Galarza described his experience as challenging and mentioned that counselors really helped him enjoy the experience of joining Hartnell. Student Elijah explained that from his point of view, he thinks students should be given more direction when choosing a major because many times students end up a degree in something they don't know much about because they weren't aware of what they could do with that degree at first. Vice President Rivera mentioned that as an AB-540 student she has struggled with how tedious and long financial aid for dreamer students take to process. She also mentioned that it was very helpful that during her high school years the MAESTROs program was able to help her find help when first joining Hartnell. Director Menchaca spoke about the necessity of more outreach from the Transfer center.

Counselor Tony Anderson was joined by Prof. Cabrera from MPC to speak about a Juneteenth event at Hartnell. They provided info on how this event has been held prior years and the activities it included. Prof. Cabrera said that volunteers are needed and invited the students to help coordinate and plan the event to hand out food and supervise some of the games.
